<p>Selection Criteria Student Mobility</p>	<p>Minimum Requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • enrolment in one of the above-mentioned study programmes • English skills on the level B2 <p>Proposed Ranking Criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study phase and fit of the study subject (students in higher semesters and students very close to the subject are selected with priority): 30% • Academic performance, volunteerism: 40% (students with very good academic performance and high volunteerism will be prioritized) • Demonstrated financial need: 30% (students with financial need will be prioritized) <p>ISU has developed an official set of rules and regulations regarding student and staff selection procedures. Additionally, the selection procedure and criteria is further discussed with each partner university and there is room to make necessary changes based on the partner university requirements. Requested documents include copies of their previous diplomas, transcripts of records, language certificates (min. B2 level), Europass format CV-s, recommendation letter, as well as a mandatory set of questions about motivation and future plans.</p> <p>Selection process is performed in 4 stages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • eligibility check, • document evaluation (max. 80 points = 40 academic merit + 40 language proficiency), • interview (max. 20 points), • nomination and final selection by the host. <p>The documents will be evaluated by IRO based on merit and quality of the application. The short-listed candidates will be invited to interview which is conducted in English (or other language of instruction at the host HEI).</p>

Recognition at Ilia State University, Georgia	ISU uses the ECTS grading scale. Prior to the departure, the student is expected to develop a learning agreement/study plan, listing the courses she/he plans to take at the host university. The list has to be approved (before mobility takes place) by the relevant faculty of the home university. Once the learning agreement is approved by the faculty, it is signed by the

	<p>dean. This is a guarantee that the faculty will recognize the credits the student earns at the host university.</p> <p>During the mobility there might be changes made to the list of selected courses. The changes also have to be approved by the relevant faculty of the home university.</p> <p>After the mobility period the student starts the recognition procedure. First, she/he applies to the home university submitting the transcript of records received from the host university. The home faculty by issuing the official letter confirms that ECTS received in host country are relevant to the student's academic program and can be recognized within the program. After that the student submits the transcript from the host university and the confirmation letter issued by the home faculty to the center of the National Center for Educational Quality Enhancement, which is the Legal Entity of Public law within the Ministry of Education and Science of Georgia. The final confirmation whether ECTS can be recognized or not, is made by the National Center.</p> <p>The courses taken abroad are clearly identifiable on the transcript of records and diploma supplements issued by ISU.</p>
