

# **FSB (Subject-Specific Provisions) for the Master of Arts Degree Programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education**

**(120 ECTS Credits)**

at Julius-Maximilians-Universität Würzburg

dated 6<sup>th</sup> August 2025

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Art. 9 Sentences 1 and 2 in conjunction with Art. 80 (1) and Art. 84 (2) Sentence 1 *Bayerisches Hochschulinnovationsgesetz* (Bavarian higher education innovation act, BayHIG) dated 5 August 2022 (*Bayerisches Gesetz- und Verordnungsblatt* (Bavarian law and ordinance gazette, GVBl) p. 414, *Bayerische Rechtssammlung* (collection of Bavarian laws, BayRS) 2210-1-3-WK) as amended from time to time in conjunction with Section 1 (2) Sentence 1 of the general academic and examination regulations for Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes (ASPO) at Julius-Maximilians-Universität Würzburg (JMU) dated 1 July 2015 (available for download at: [http://www.uni-wuerzburg.de/aml\\_veroeffentlichungen/2015-4](http://www.uni-wuerzburg.de/aml_veroeffentlichungen/2015-4)) form the framework for the following subject-specific provisions decreed by Julius-Maximilians-Universität Würzburg, which are hereby announced:

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## Part 1: General Provisions

### Section 1 Scope

These subject-specific provisions (FSB) supplement the general academic and examination regulations for Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes (ASPO) at Julius-Maximilians-Universität Würzburg (JMU) dated 1 July 2015 as amended from time to time.

### Section 2 Aims and Objectives of the Degree Programme

(1) <sup>1</sup>The Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education programme leading to the degree of Master of Arts (MA) is offered by the Faculty of Human Sciences of JMU in the framework of a consecutive Bachelor's/Master's model. <sup>2</sup>The Master of Arts degree is a further professional and research-oriented university degree.

<sup>3</sup>The programme aims to provide an in-depth understanding of issues and problems related to adult education, continuing education, and lifelong learning. <sup>4</sup>Students develop professional knowledge that enables them to independently and flexibly adapt to the demands of the job market for education professionals across various fields. (2) <sup>1</sup>The Master's programme can be studied entirely in English. <sup>2</sup>To offer students additional options, the mandatory electives area also includes modules that are taught in German only. <sup>3</sup>If approved, students may write their Master's thesis in German.

(3) <sup>1</sup>The degree programme provides the opportunity to participate in international exchange programmes that are offered in cooperation with selected foreign partner universities. <sup>2</sup>The relevant details have been laid down in the cooperation agreements between the universities involved, which will be published in the customary manner (e.g. on the web pages of the Faculty of Human Sciences of JMU).

### Section 3 Start, Structure, and Standard Length of Programme

(1) In accordance with Section 7 ASPO, the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education offers both winter and summer intake.

(2) <sup>1</sup>The degree programme is structured as follows:

<sup>2</sup>In the mandatory electives area, students must achieve a minimum of 10 ECTS credits in total from modules with numerical grading.

(3) The standard length of programme for the MA in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education is four semesters, in which students will have to earn a total of 120 ECTS credits.

(4) <sup>1</sup>Students who participate in the international exchange programme mentioned in Section 2 (3) can earn a double degree from JMU and the respective foreign partner university. <sup>2</sup>Students who do not participate in an exchange programme can only earn the degree mentioned in Section 2 (1) from JMU.

#### **Section 4 Prerequisites for Admission to the Programme, Recommended Fundamental Knowledge and Skills**

(1) <sup>1</sup>Admission to the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education is conditional on the following prerequisites

- a) A Bachelor's degree (180 ECTS credits) completed at JMU or another higher education institution in Germany or abroad or an equivalent German or foreign qualification (e.g. state examination),
- b) Proof of having earned at least 40 ECTS credits in the following areas, usually acquired in the framework of the first degree indicated under Letter a) above (according to the ECTS credit scheme used at JMU for the Bachelor's programme in Pedagogy):
  - Microlevel of education (e.g. teaching, learning, didactics, methodology, pedagogical action)
  - Mesolevel of education (e.g. programme planning, organisational development, leadership)
  - Macrolevel of education (e.g. educational policy, education law, educational theories, theories on social context conditions)

These ECTS credits must come from at least two of the levels of (adult) education mentioned above, the minimum number of ECTS credits required per level being 5

or – in the case of programmes not modularised within the meaning of the ECTS – knowledge and skills on a corresponding scale.

The required knowledge and skills can be developed, for example, by studying the Pedagogy programme leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts (180 ECTS credits), studying Pedagogy as a major for a Bachelor of Arts degree (120 ECTS credits), or studying Pedagogy as a major for a Bachelor's degree (85 or 75 ECTS credits) at JMU.

- c) Proof of the required language skills:

To qualify for admission, applicants must possess

English language skills at B2 level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) or higher. Applicants must provide suitable proof of their language skills, for example:

- aa) Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) with at least 72 points (internet-based TOEFL test) or
- bb) International English Language Test System (IELTS) with a result of 6.0 or higher or
- cc) Cambridge First Certificate in English (FCE) or
- dd) A grade in English of at least 'satisfactory' (*befriedigend*; equivalent to at least 7 out of 15 points) as part of a German higher education entrance qualification
- or
- A foreign higher education entrance qualification with proof of English language proficiency which is at least equivalent to the above-mentioned higher education entrance qualification or
- ee) Proof that training (in particular in the framework of the first degree indicated under a) above) has been completed which demanded English language skills on the level specified in aa) to dd) above.

d) and

Proof of aptitude for the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education furnished in the framework of an aptitude assessment procedure (cf. Appendix 'Aptitude Assessment Procedure').

<sup>2</sup>The aptitude assessment panel will decide whether the requirements set out in Sentence 1 Letter a) as well as the requirements regarding the minimum knowledge and skills (Sentence 1 Letter b)) and language skills (Sentence 1 Letter c)) are met. <sup>3</sup>When deciding on the equivalence of first degrees with the above-mentioned reference qualification as well as for verifying the required minimum knowledge and skills and their scale (in particular in the case of non-modularised programmes), the principle of reverse burden of proof and the obligation to establish equivalence if there are no significant differences with regard to the knowledge and skills acquired (learning outcomes) apply in accordance with Art. 86 BayHIG of 5 August 2022 (GVBl. p. 414, BayRS 2210-1-3-WK).

(2) <sup>1</sup>In the case that the requirements set out in (1) Sentence 1 Letter a) and/or b) and/or c) are not met, admission to the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education will not be possible, unless admission to the Master's programme is possible in accordance with (3). <sup>2</sup>In this case, applicants will receive a corresponding notification stating the reasons for the decision and instructions on the available legal remedies.

(3) <sup>1</sup>If the requirements set out in (1) Sentence 1 Letters a) and b) are met, applicants will be admitted to the aptitude assessment procedure (cf. Appendix 'Aptitude Assessment Procedure').

<sup>2</sup>Applicants who complete the aptitude assessment procedure successfully will be entitled to commence the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education at JMU, as long as the requirements for this programme do not substantially change. <sup>3</sup>Applicants who fail to complete the aptitude assessment procedure successfully will receive a corresponding notification stating the reasons for the decision and instructions on the available legal remedies.

<sup>4</sup>Applicants will be offered one opportunity to repeat a failed aptitude assessment procedure for the Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education programme.

(4) <sup>1</sup>In order to facilitate an uninterrupted transition from a first degree, in particular a Bachelor's degree, to the Master's programme, applicants who are not yet able to produce corresponding proof of the degree required in accordance with (1) Sentence 1 Letter a) at the time of application may be admitted to the Master's programme in the semester immediately following, subject to a resolute condition as follows:

- a) Proof at the time of application of at least 150 ECTS credits in total or – in the case of programmes not modularised within the meaning of the ECTS – academic achievements on a corresponding scale in the first degree required in accordance with (1) Sentence 1 Letter a),
- b) Proof of at least 40 ECTS credits earned at the time of application from modules in the areas mentioned in (1) Sentence 1 Letter b) or – in the case of programmes not modularised within the meaning of the ECTS – knowledge and skills on a corresponding scale,
- c) Proof of the language skills required under (1) Sentence 1 Letter c)
- d) and  
Proof of aptitude for the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education furnished in the framework of an aptitude assessment procedure (cf. Appendix 'Aptitude Assessment Procedure').

<sup>2</sup>In the event that the resolutive condition takes effect, i.e. that proof of the first degree specified in (1) Sentence 1 Letter a) is not produced at the latest by the end of the re-enrolment period for the third subject semester in the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education, the applicant must be disenrolled at the end of the second subject semester.

<sup>3</sup>If the resolutive condition does not take effect, the applicant will be granted final admission to the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education.

### **Section 5 Minimum ECTS Score Requirement**

These FSB do not prescribe a minimum ECTS score requirement as described in Section 13 (5) ASPO.

### **Section 6 Examination Committee**

- (1) The examination committee will be set up as stipulated in Section 14 (1) Sentence 3 ASPO.
- (2) The committee may decide to bring in additional members for consultation and advice.

## **Part 2: Assessments**

### **Section 7 Other Subject-Specific Assessments**

(1) These FSB prescribe the following subject-specific assessments: report, presentation, log, review, essay, discussion leadership, academic poster, text production, listening and reading exercise as well as discussion contributions.

(2) <sup>1</sup>Reports are written assessments to be prepared at home in which examinees are expected to demonstrate their ability to present the contents of a course or the activities undertaken within a course (in particular a practical course, field trip, or empirical research project) in a structured and commensurate manner. <sup>2</sup>Depending on the context, the term 'report' may also appear in the SFB (list of modules) as a compound term, in particular as a research report, a lab report, or a field trip report.

(3) In presentations, examinees are expected to demonstrate their ability to explore topics assigned to them according to academic standards and present the results of their work in oral form; in addition, examinees may be required to submit a written account of their work and/or to present their findings in media format (e.g. animation, video, poster, handout).

(4) In logs, students have to present the results of the joint exploration of a topic or of a seminar or lecture unit in written form, to discuss them, and, where applicable, to deliver a presentation on them, using primary and secondary sources.

(5) <sup>1</sup>A review as a method of assessment is a written discussion of a new academic publication that complies with the standards for form and content of the medium in which the review would appear. <sup>2</sup>Section 23 (8) ASPO will apply, *mutatis mutandis*, to reviews. <sup>3</sup>An exhibition review is the review of an exhibition based on museological criteria. A review as a method of assessment in modules in the field of European Ethnology/Cultural Anthropology is a written summary and discussion of an academic publication in which examinees are expected to demonstrate that they have critically engaged with the reviewed work and can situate its content in the debate within the discipline.

(6) <sup>1</sup>An essay is a critical and subjective discussion of a problem in an academic discipline in written form that is prepared at home or in an invigilated setting. <sup>2</sup>In essays, students are expected to present their own ideas and arguments in a precise and reflexive manner and provide a justification of their point of view that complies with academic standards.

(7) Discussion leadership: During a seminar session, students will lead the discussion on a pre-assigned topic, having prepared for doing so at home as agreed upon with the competent teacher and using suitable academic literature.

(8) An academic poster is a written assessment in which examinees present a topic in an academic discipline or research findings in a concise, visual format.

(9) Text production is a method of assessment that requires examinees to demonstrate their ability to produce a written-out text, incorporating the materials provided to them.

(10) A reading and listening exercise is a written assessment in which examinees are expected to complete tasks relating to a text they have heard or read (e.g. answer questions, summarise the text) and, for this purpose, have to engage with the content of this text.

(11) The 'discussion contributions' method of assessment requires students to discuss a range of topics orally and to present arguments to substantiate what they say (e.g. during roundtable discussions or role-play sessions).

### **Section 8 Area of Degree Finalisation: Master's Thesis and Thesis Defence**

<sup>1</sup>The Master's thesis will be worth either 30 or 25 ECTS credits. <sup>2</sup>In either case, the time allowed for completing the thesis will be six months. <sup>3</sup>For the purposes of Section 26 ASPO, the two thesis modules will be treated as one thesis module.

(2) <sup>1</sup>Where Master's theses worth 30 ECTS credits are concerned, there will be no thesis defence.

<sup>2</sup>Where Master's theses worth 25 ECTS credits are concerned, there will be a thesis defence.

### **Section 9 Overall Grade, Grade in Degree Subject, and Grades Awarded for Individual Areas**

<sup>1</sup>A student's overall grade will be calculated in accordance with the provisions of Section 35 (1) ASPO. <sup>2</sup>The grade for the subject Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education will be calculated in accordance with Section 35 (2) ASPO, and the grades for the individual areas will be calculated in accordance with Section 35 (3) to (5) ASPO.

<sup>3</sup>The hierarchy model described in Section 35 (5) Sentences 3 to 6 ASPO will be used for the calculation of the grade awarded for the mandatory courses area and the area of degree finalisation.

<sup>4</sup>The basket model described in Section 35 (5) Sentences 7 to 8 ASPO will be used for the calculation of the grade awarded for the mandatory electives area.

<sup>5</sup>When calculating the grade for the degree subject and the overall grade, the individual areas will be assigned the following weight values:

### Part 3: Final Provisions

#### Section 10 Entry into Force

<sup>1</sup>These FSB will enter into force on the day following their announcement. <sup>2</sup>They apply to all students enrolled in the degree programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education that leads to the award of the degree of Master of Arts (120 ECTS credits) who commence studies in this programme at JMU in the winter semester 2025/2026 or later and whose programmes are governed by the general academic and examination regulations (ASPO) for the Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes at Julius-Maximilians-Universität Würzburg dated 1 July 2015 as amended from time to time.

## **Appendix 'Aptitude Assessment Procedure'**

<sup>1</sup>Admission to the Master's programme will be conditional on passing an aptitude assessment procedure. <sup>2</sup>This will be conducted as described below.

### **Section 1 Purpose of the Aptitude Assessment Procedure**

<sup>1</sup>The purpose of the aptitude assessment procedure is to gauge, based on

1. educational background, in particular the academic achievements leading to the first degree, and
2. subject-related and methodical skills in the subfields of pedagogy indicated in Section 4 (1) Sentence 1 Letter b) or, respectively, Section 4 (4) Sentence 1 Letter b) FSB

who is qualified for the Master's programme. <sup>2</sup>The aim is to determine whether applicants meet the very high requirements of the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education and will be able to conduct academic work independently. <sup>3</sup>Qualifying for the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education presupposes the applicants' aptitude according to the following rules.

### **Section 2 Aptitude Assessment Procedure**

(1) The aptitude assessment procedure will be conducted each semester by the Faculty of Human Sciences of JMU.

(2)<sup>1</sup>Applications for admission to the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education for the following semester must be submitted to the chairperson of the examination committee by 15 July (for winter intake) or by 15 January (for summer intake) in the form specified by the aptitude assessment panel (cf. (3)) for the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education and by the applicable closing date; in particular, an electronic application procedure via the relevant JMU web pages may be foreseen here.

<sup>2</sup>Should there be reasons beyond the applicants' control, the documents referred to in (3) No. 1 Letter a) may be submitted later and by 15 September (for winter intake) or 15 March (for summer intake) at the latest to be granted final admission to the Master's programme. <sup>3</sup>In the event that applicants cannot meet the closing date (e.g. because their Bachelor's degree certificate has not yet been issued), the only remaining option will be admission subject to a resolute condition in accordance with Section 4 (4) FSB.

(3) <sup>1</sup>Applications for admission must include:

1. Proof of academic achievements from the first degree as specified in Section 4 (1) Sentence 1 Letter a) FSB,
  - a) Proof of a university degree or an equivalent qualification (in the case of applications for final admission to the Master's programme) or
  - b) Proof of 150 ECTS credits or – in the case of programmes not modularised within the meaning of the ECTS – academic achievements on a corresponding scale (in the case of applications for admission to the Master's programme subject to a resolute condition), and
2. An overview of previous study and examination achievements (transcript of records or comparable document) detailing the modules passed in the areas indicated in Section 4 (1) Sentence 1 Letter b) FSB and the examination achievements attributed to them, including the ECTS credits and grades awarded or – in the case of programmes not modularised within the meaning of the ECTS – academic achievements on a corresponding scale and, where applicable, accredited examination achievements or, in the case of applications for admission to the Master's programme subject to a resolute condition, a provisional overview of study and examination achievements

with the details referred to above. It must above all be clear from the overview that applicants have acquired the knowledge and skills required for the Master's programme in Adult Education and Management in Lifelong Education in accordance with Section 4 (1) Sentence 1 Letter b) FSB (in the case of applications for final admission to the Master's programme) or Section 4 (4) Sentence 1 Letter b) FSB (in the case of applications for admission to the Master's programme subject to a resolutive condition).

<sup>2</sup>The documents referred to in Sentence 1 above must generally be submitted in German or English (where necessary, as a certified German or English translation). <sup>3</sup>Where necessary, applicants may be required to submit certified German or English translations of documents issued in languages other than those mentioned in Sentence 2 above.

### **Section 3 Aptitude Assessment Panel**

<sup>1</sup>The aptitude assessment procedure will be conducted by a panel comprising three members, which must include at least one member in the rank of professor as well as two additional persons who are authorised to administer university examinations (Art. 85 BayHIG, *Hochschulprüferverordnung* (directive on higher education examiners, HSchPrüferV)).

<sup>2</sup>The members of the aptitude assessment panel will be appointed by the Faculty Board of the Faculty of Human Sciences for a period of three years; reappointment will be permitted. <sup>3</sup>The chairperson and a deputy chairperson will be elected by the panel members by a simple majority.

<sup>4</sup>The aptitude assessment panel will be quorate if its members have been summoned with due notice of three days and the majority of the members are present. <sup>5</sup>In the case of elections and other decisions (especially within the aptitude assessment procedure), the panel will decide by simple majority vote. <sup>6</sup>In the event of a tied vote, the chairperson will have the casting vote.

### **Section 4 Participation in the Aptitude Assessment Procedure, Scale and Content of the Aptitude Assessment Procedure, Establishment and Announcement of the Result, Minutes**

(1) Participation in the aptitude assessment procedure presupposes, in addition to the fulfilment of the requirements in accordance with Section 4 FSB, that the documents indicated in Section 2 (3) have been received in full and by the due date.

(2) <sup>1</sup>The aptitude assessment procedure will be a single-step process:

<sup>2</sup>The applicants' suitability for the programme will be assessed based on the documents they submit. <sup>3</sup>To be considered suitable for admission to the programme, applicants must

1. have achieved a final grade of 2.2 or better in the first degree required in accordance with Section 4 (1) Sentence 1 Letter a) FSB (in the case of applications for final admission to the programme) or
2. have achieved an average grade of 2.2 or better in the academic achievements on a scale of 150 ECTS credits that are required in accordance with Section 4 (4) Sentence 1 Letter a) FSB (in the case of applications for admission to the programme subject to a resolutive condition) or
3. have achieved an average grade of 2.0 or better in the area of adult/continuing education with at least 25 ECTS credits according to Section 4 (1) Sentence 1 Letter b) FSB (in the case of applications for final admission to the programme) or Section 4 (4) Sentence 1 Letter b) FSB (in the case of applications for admission to the programme subject to a resolutive condition); the modules will be assigned to the individual areas according to the ECTS credit scheme used at JMU for the Bachelor's programme in Pedagogy.

<sup>4</sup>Applicants who failed to achieve the grade required in accordance with Sentence 3 No. 1, 2, or 3 will be rejected on the grounds of insufficient aptitude.

<sup>5</sup>The average grade referred to in Sentence 3 No. 2 above will be calculated in the following manner: In a first step, a list will be compiled of all graded modules that the applicant has successfully completed and the modules arranged in the order of the grades awarded for them with the module for which the best grade was awarded at the top of the list and, if the same grade was awarded for two or more modules, with the module worth the highest number of ECTS credits at the top; in a next step, modules will be selected from this list and their credit values added up until their combined ECTS credit value is 150; the average grade will then be calculated based on the ECTS-credit weighted average (weighted arithmetic mean) of the grades achieved in the modules selected from the list with the last module used in the calculation being weighted only with the ECTS credits remaining to reach the credit requirement of 150. <sup>6</sup>The grade will be calculated to one decimal place; all other decimal places will be dropped without rounding. <sup>7</sup>If an applicant has successfully completed modules worth at least 150 ECTS credits but fewer than 150 of these ECTS credits come from modules with numerical grading, only the modules with numerical grading will be taken into account.

<sup>8</sup>In the calculation of the average grade referred to in Sentence 3 No. 3 above, only those successfully completed graded modules will be taken into account that are assigned to one of the relevant areas and modules will be selected from the list and their credit values added up until their combined ECTS credit value is 25; apart from that, the grade will be calculated in the manner described in Sentences 5 to 7 above, which will apply *mutatis mutandis*.

<sup>9</sup>In the event that the grading system used for the first degree completed (or the grades obtained) at another university is not identical to the grading system used at JMU, the provisions of Section 18 (5) ASPO will apply, *mutatis mutandis*, with regard to grade conversion, with the modification that the aptitude assessment panel will take the place of the examination committee as the competent body.

(3) <sup>1</sup>Applicants will be notified in writing of the result of the aptitude assessment procedure; if aptitude has been established, applicants must present the respective notification at the time of enrolment. <sup>2</sup>Rejections must state the reasons for the decision and instructions on the available legal remedies.

Conventions for the modules in this SFB: Unless otherwise stated, courses and assessments will be held in German, assessments will be offered every semester and modules are not creditable for bonus.

Information on assessment procedures: Should there be the option to choose between several methods of assessment, the lecturer will agree with the module coordinator on the method of assessment to be used in the current semester by two weeks after the start of the course at the latest and will communicate this in the customary manner.

Should a module comprise more than one graded assessment, all assessments will be equally weighted, unless otherwise stated below.
