## 2. APPLICATION

**Language Requirements**

Sufficient language skills to follow the courses are required, the minimum language level required for students are noted in the Inter-Institutional Agreement between Würzburg University and the Partner University.

In general, if students wish to earn ECTS in Würzburg, they should be able to demonstrate at least a B1 language level in the teaching language. However, we advise students to prepare with B2 for their studies at Julius-Maximilians-University of Würzburg. Students can search for the [teaching language and Language Proficiency](#) of the different subjects in advance on our website.

**Faculties Available to KA 171-Exchange Students**

Inter-Institutional Agreements within Erasmus KA171 are subject/department-based agreements, meaning that Erasmus students are supposed to attend courses from their subject area or a neighboring subject.

**Nomination Deadline and Procedure**

Nominations are welcome by email (to [erasmus171@uni-wuerzburg.de](mailto:erasmus171@uni-wuerzburg.de) AND [nomination@uni-wuerzburg.de](mailto:nomination@uni-wuerzburg.de) by **March 15<sup>th</sup>** for the winter semester and **September 15<sup>th</sup>** for the summer semester).

Please be aware, that we have to follow the selection regulations of the ERASMUS-Program. Within the ERASMUS-Program we have to follow a fair selection process with transparent selection criteria. The possibility for taking part in student mobility has to be announced publicly within your university. Any discrimination (e.g. due to sex, gender, age, ethnic, special needs) is not allowed. This ERASMUS 171-Project intends to support around 30-50% with less opportunities (see information below). For the preparation of a transparent selection process, we provide you a table, which should help to plan the selection process. We strongly advise to send a previous list until **March 30<sup>th</sup>** for winter semester and **September 30<sup>th</sup>** for summer semester to [erasmus171@uni-wuerzburg.de](mailto:erasmus171@uni-wuerzburg.de). We are happy to give you feedback, if the nomination list is following the ERASMUS-regulations.

Please reach out to the Erasmus Coordinator of the respective department as they are responsible for the academic consultation.

The following information should be included on the excel nomination Document: Name of nominee(s), email address, field and level of study, language proficiency, period of stay and other relevant information (e.g., special needs).

Important: Nominees have to be enrolled at your institution.

## 4. HOUSING AND ACCOMODATION

### Housing Information

The University of Würzburg has a special arrangement with the Student Housing Service of the "Studierendenwerk", an independent organisation which is not connected to the university.

If international students from our partner universities apply for a room in a dormitory and transfer the housing deposit and rental prepayment (€ 1000) by the official application **deadline accommodation will be guaranteed**.

The Student Housing Service is responsible for ten dormitories in various locations in Würzburg.

Amenities:

- Single apartments or single rooms in shared apartments, in which two to four students share a kitchen and bathroom;
- All rooms and apartments are furnished;
- Dishes, cooking items, bedding, and towels are not provided;
- Rents range from € 250 to € 400 per month, depending on the size of the room/apartment and its equipment

Length of stay:

Student accommodations are granted for six months (beginning with the semester on April 1<sup>st</sup> or October 1<sup>st</sup>) or 12 months (for one year stay). A shorter rental period is not possible!

If students want to participate at the German intensive language course, the rental period will increase by one month from 6 to 7 months / 12 to 13 months. Please note: Students must ensure to select the correct months when applying for a room (include September for the winter semester / March for the summer semester, if attending the intensive German course).

### Deadline

Please note: Dormitory housing is only guaranteed if students apply and pay the deposit by the deadline! **Please note that students can already apply for housing without having the admission letter from us!** After we receive the official nomination, the students will receive an email with further information on how to apply for dormitories including the online application link.

### Costs and Financing

Costs of living: approx. € 1000 / month (depending on your lifestyle and apartment rent). **Please note:** Students have to make sure they have sufficient funds to cover all expenses while abroad, including rent and semester contribution. Students will only be enrolled, if the semester contribution has been transferred and if sufficient health insurance coverage has been presented.

### Visa Requirements and Resident Permit

If a visa is required, information can be found on the website of the [the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs](#)

For a student's visa, there are the following requirements:

- a proven secured livelihood in the amount of the BaföG rate (as of Nov. 2024, € 992 per month) for the whole time of the stay. If the Erasmus grant is lower, a blocked account must be opened to cover the difference.
- sufficient health insurance coverage, without the use of public funds, for the whole time of the stay.
- Students from the European Union and several other countries (e.g. EFTA-countries, USA and Japan) do not need a visa to enter Germany, just a valid passport or identification card; however, exchange students who are not from an EU country need a resident permit. Make an appointment with the [Würzburg Immigration Office \(Ausländeramt\)](#) in the City Hall as soon as possible after your arrival.
- Request your visa well in advance. Gathering all required documents takes time; Upon arrival, students might need to register for a [residence permit](#) (approx. € 100) if the visa does not cover the whole duration of the stay.

### Insurance Requirements

Adequate [health insurance](#) is required for registration. Home insurance companies should be contacted before departing to Germany. A German statutory insurance company must verify the insurance status of students. If the insurance status is not sufficient, a German full cover health insurance must be purchased for the duration of stay (must be verified by the statutory health insurance) more information can be found on our [website](#). Please be aware, that this is a formal regulation for the registration, which doesn't allow any exceptions. In addition, we highly recommend students to have **liability insurance** while staying in Germany. It can either be bought in Germany or the home insurance covers the exchange period abroad (please check with your provider). Liability insurance covers the responsibility for damage caused to persons, objects or assets up to a certain amount. The higher this amount, the higher the annual fee.
