

PRAKTIKUM IN DEN PALÄSTINENSISCHEN GEBIETEN–DVV INTERNATIONAL

Der **Deutsche Volkshochschul-Verband International (DVV International)** bietet in Kooperation mit seinen Partnereinrichtungen mehrere Praktika Stellen in den Palästinensischen Gebieten an. Es sind Aufenthalte von **zwei bis drei Monaten** möglich und der Zeitraum kann individuell ausgesucht werden. Angeboten werden die Plätze:

- DVV International Palestine - Ramallah
- Dar al-Kalima University College of Arts and Culture - Bethlehem
- Al Saraya Center for Community Service - East Jerusalem
- Karmel Community Center for Youth and Adult Education - Karmel town/ Yatta, South Hebron
- Yamoun Community Center for Youth and Adult Education - Yamoun town/ North Jenin
- Arraba Community Center for Youth and Adult Education - Arraba town/ South Jenin

Die Praktika können individuell in den Studienverlaufsplan eingebunden werden, beispielsweise in der vorlesungsfreien Zeit, wodurch die Regelstudienzeit nicht verlängert werden muss. Je nach Aufenthalt kann es zu Überschneidungen einiger Vorlesungs- und Prüfungstage kommen. Hier wird dann nach einer individuellen Lösung gesucht. Für die Teilnahme an einem Praktikum gelten keine Voraussetzungen bezüglich Ihrer bisher erreichten Noten.

Bei Interesse erfolgt zunächst eine formlose Bewerbung; Infos erhalten Sie in einem persönlichen Gespräch in der Sprechstunde. Danach müssen einige Formulare ausgefüllt werden, bei denen wir gerne behilflich sind.

Bewerben können Sie sich als **Bachelor**studierende, **Master**studierende und **Doktorand/inn/en** aus der Pädagogik/Bildungswissenschaft.

Stipendium (700€/Monat)

Im Rahmen von Erasmus+ stehen zwei Stipendien von monatlich 700€ und einmalig 360€ Reisekostenzuschuss pro Person für einen Aufenthalt von 2-3 Monaten zur Verfügung.

What are the interns expected to do?

The tasks differ from one center to another.

DVV International:

The office supports one civil society provider of adult education and three newly established community-based centers for youth and adult education, in addition to the work with Dar al-Kalima as a capacity building partner in Bethlehem. The student will be working at the office in Ramallah, but also joining regular field work of the project coordinator in the mentioned communities.

Dar al-Kalima University College of Art and Culture:

DAK is supporting the development of the community-based centers in developing their new adult education offers in culture, arts, tourism, languages, and culinary arts. Interns who work with DAK will be expected to be part of the teams working in the DAK Academy (art and cultural offerings for teenagers/college students). They can also be involved in the support DAK provides for the community-based AE centers, in developing ideas and implementing part of the activities with the youth and other leaders.

Al Saraya Centre:

At the Al Saraya Centre in Jerusalem, interns can support the summer/winter camps that the center organizes for students before they choose their education paths (vocational/scientific/humanities) to introduce them to different types of vocations and workplaces. Furthermore, they can be part of activities with the youth and women volunteers in developing community initiatives and empowerment activities.

Community-based centers:

In the community-based centers in the West Bank, the interns will be involved in bringing up ideas for development of the offerings, as well as co-facilitating learning activities with the learners and the community members (based on their fields of study). The types of offerings include cultural heritage preservation, environmental education, language exchange and support for new volunteers from the communities.

All interns are expected to contribute to communication/ visibility/ documentation aspects of the ALE work of the partners, and in some cases to do translation of stories to German.

Where will the interns live?

The centers are located in different areas. While Ramallah, Jerusalem and Bethlehem cities are easier to live in, in terms of knowledge of English among the people and familiarity of having international presence, some of the interns will be placed in other cities as well. Centers are mostly not in the cities themselves but in nearby towns.

Language requirements?

A command of English is required, and some knowledge of Arabic can be of advantage. If necessary, an English course can be taken locally. Even if some teams of the centers can speak English, interns should expect that translation would be needed all the time if they are working with learners or participants from the local communities.

Once the dates of the internships are specified, detailed plans will be developed for the intern.



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
